There has been a recent change in the behaviour of men in Macclesfield who have been found to be gathering in sheds, building things and sharing stories

"The Maccy Men's Shed is a local success story for all those involved," said Ken Smith, coordinator of the Macclesfield Men's Shed.

"A few years ago we decided a men's shed would be a great idea and started looking for a suitable place and permission to have in at the Macrlesfield Recreation grounds (next to the old change rooms at the main ovely".

Thanks to a local farmer, a large unused shed was sourced, dismanded and relocated by the group to its new site. After numerous busy bees (and the odd coffee bresk) it was rebuilt to cater for future use by the group.

"We are all thankful to our local community for their support and donations of very useful equipment to get the shed started" Ken said.

"We've had wonderful support from the Macclesfield Uniting Church, Council (especially local council (is the Australian Mon's Shed Association (community groups) and numerous other people".

"Men of all ages and locations are velcome, we even have members from Strathalbyn and Prospect Hill. Our main aim is to provide a place for men to meet and engage in activities which add value to our community" acided Ken.

"The Maccy Men's Shed has developed a safe and happy environment where men are we come to work or community projects (or a project of their rheise) and where the only 'must' is to observe safe working practices in the solit of mateship," said Peter McGian, Council's Senior Community Development Offices.

"This is a great win for Macclesfield and for the entire District. The potential partnerships and benefits of local groups such as this Men's Shed will only be United to the creative capacities and imaginations of their members and will deliver lantastic outcomes to all concerned" added Peter

The new mon's shed is working closely with other local community groups and businesses, and an umber of projects and courses have already been identified to provide benefit to the wider community whilst giving purpose and meaning to those in the shed.

"We look forward to our shed being an important and respected addition to our community and thank every one of our members for the fantastic achievement of establishing our shed over the last couple of years" Ken said.

"The shed is not fully operational yet, but we expect to have an official opening in a few months!"


